*A Reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians*

Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Quicken, we pray, your Spirit within us, that we, being renewed both in body and mind, may worship you in sincerity and truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**
